Information

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Business is a two-year management program that combines classroom with practical on-the-job training. The Business AAS curriculum includes courses designed to provide a practical, comprehensive program covering certain managerial/accounting activities. The program is designed to meet the needs of people preparing for careers in the business management or accounting industry.

Students enrolling into San Jacinto College programs with external learning experiences (i.e., clinical, practicum, externship, cooperative, etc.) will be required to comply with the immunization requirements and policies of the clinical/external learning sites to engage in all clinical/external learning experiences. Vaccination requirements at clinical/external learning sites are implemented pursuant to the independent authority of such facilities and are not mandated by San Jacinto College.

Failure to meet the immunization requirements mandated by clinical/ external learning sites may limit a student's ability to complete the program and/or may delay the student's graduation date.
