EYE CARE TECHNOLOGY, CERTIFICATE OF TECHNOLOGY



Information

A criminal background check and drug screening are required for all Health Science students attending clinical courses or practicum and may be required prior to admission to the program.

The Eye Care Technology program consists of three levels of preparation. Students may obtain an Occupational Certificate, a Certificate of Technology, or an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree. This program is designed to correlate classroom and laboratory experience with clinical experience in ophthalmic offices and clinics.

The Eye Care Technology program is accredited by the International Council of Accreditation (ICA). The graduates of the AAS degree are eligible to petition for examination through the International Joint Commission on Allied Health Personnel in Ophthalmology at the certified ophthalmic technician level. Graduates of any of the three levels are eligible to petition for examination through the American Board of Opticianry for certification as an optician and/or the National Contact Lens Examiner.

Students enrolling into San Jacinto College programs with external learning experiences (i.e., clinical, practicum, externship, cooperative, etc.) will be required to comply with the immunization requirements and policies of the clinical/external learning sites to engage in all clinical/external learning experiences. Vaccination requirements at clinical/external learning sites are implemented pursuant to the independent authority of such facilities and are not mandated by San Jacinto College. Failure to meet the immunization requirements mandated by clinical/external learning sites may limit a student's ability to complete the program and/or may delay the student's graduation date. San Jacinto College does not process exemptions, and students should address potential vaccination exemptions directly with the clinical/external learning site.
