

- or CHEM 1311 General Chemistry I (lecture)/CHEM 1111 General Chemistry I (lab)
- BIOL 1322 Nutrition and Diet Therapy

*Note: Prospective students are encouraged to complete all academic courses prior to entry into the nursing program.

Requirements

The College requires that students adhere to the following list for entry into the RN-to-BSN program:

- · Completed AAS in Nursing from an accredited institution;
- Hold an unencumbered, Texas RN license. License must be valid through the program duration;
- Be currently employed as a professional nurse (Letter from Employer required);
- · Maintain a cumulative GPA 2.5 on a 4.0 scale:

- Reflect a grade of C in all previous nursing and science transfer courses: and
- Submit one recommendation letter from employer supervisor or former nursing faculty.
