

NURSING, VOCATIONAL NURSING, LEVEL 2 CERTIFICATE



Admission

Applicants for the program must meet the requirements for general admission to the College and must also meet the following specific requirements:

- Be a high school graduate, GED, or equivalent;
- Have a GPA minimum of 2.25 on college-level coursework;
- Pass a physical examination and meet specific immunization requirements; and
- Pass a criminal history check and drug screen.

Please note that a person who has been convicted of a felony that relates to the duties and responsibilities of a Licensed Vocational Nurse may be disqualified from obtaining licensure as a Licensed Vocational Nurse (213.28 Texas Board of Nursing; Rules and Regulations, February 2018). Applicants can address any concerns directly with the Texas Board of Nursing. In accordance with Texas House Bill 1508, the College informs all students in this program who may have a criminal background that a criminal history could keep graduates from being licensed by the state of Texas. Students with any questions about their background and licensure may speak with the Department Chair.

Application Dates

Applications for entry into the program are accepted each year in the fall and spring. Periodically, based on need, the North campus may offer a summer and/or evening sequence of courses.
