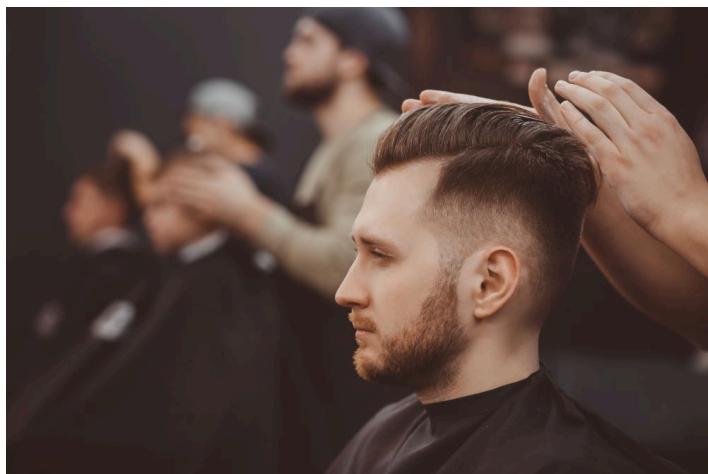


COSMETOLOGY, BARBER ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE



Overview

San Jacinto College designed the Cosmetology, Barber AAS Degree program (60 college credits/700 cosmetology and 300 barber contact hours) to provide technical and practical instruction covering the art of cosmetology and barbering to include shaving, clipper cutting, men's grooming, and men's facials. The educational goal of the cosmetology, barbering course of study is to prepare for the Class A Barber state licensing examination and for profitable employment as a barber. Students who successfully complete the Cosmetology, Barber AAS Degree curriculum are qualified to sit for the examination given by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
