All prior references to outdoor bulletin boards or kiosks have been removed. Posting Signs on Indoor Bulletin Boards: Students and student organizations may not post signs on walls, ceilings, windows, or doors of any College building. College bulletin boards are limited and not designated for free expression. General and special-

purpose bulletin boards are under the jurisdiction of the appropriate department or administrative unit maintaining them. Indoor postings require prior approval and expiration-date stamping by a Student Engagement and Activities Coordinator or designee; removal is required within 24 hours after expiration. Unauthorized postings may result in removal and disciplinary action. All references to the Dean of Student Development have been removed. Authorized College Officials: Authorized officials for postings and expressive activity approvals include the Coordinator of Student Engagement & Activities, the Director of Campus Services, or their delegates.
